THROUGH INVASIVE PLANT CONTROL...



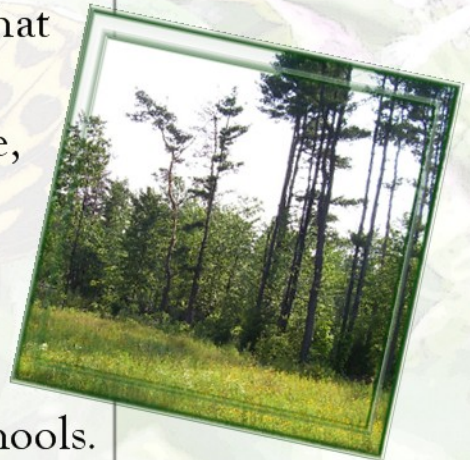
